The Plan

We agreed for the continuation of the work on local and public policies addressing Roma communities in Greece. Positive approach!

Further development of the activities and projects related to EC National Strategy on Roma in Greece. /here we have very good relation with Ms. Lina Chalilopolu, MEP, EC/

Helping/bringing Roma communities much more close than before space to make our people active citizens - to participate in mainstream society, and be agents of change on local, regional and national level in main fields as: education, employment, housing, health and media.

EDUCATION:

Continuation of the existing and designing new projects:

- Organizing activities with pre-school children, inclusion of parents and educational institutions.

- To design scheme for a scholarship support for students
